NEW START

Read how you are helping to keep families and their beloved pets together.



Sometimes our job is not finding new homes for homeless animals, sometimes it's helping animals stay in their homes. Lending a little support to someone who is trying desperately to live up to the promise of providing their dog or cat a 'forever home'. Everyone who's ever loved an animal knows the incredible bond between you and your pet. For Melissa, that bond is absolutely essential...and was about to be broken.

Melissa has been homeless off and on for the last 3 years. She's making every effort to overcome difficult circumstances and get her life back on track. Through the tremendous work of Hopelink, she was able to find transitional housing in Duvall for her and her son. But one family member was not able to move in.

Rosco is Melissa's 1 year-old Jack Russell mix, a certified therapy dog that provides aid and comfort, and assists Melissa with challenges in mental health. Rosco's been part of the family since he was a pup, but Melissa hadn't yet been able to afford to get him neutered, and that was

required by the lease. "I could lose my place to live if I don't get him neutered, and I don't have the money to pay for neutering anywhere," Melissa told our Clinic Manager when she made her first worried call to Homeward Pet.

"He's such a great dog. I could really use the help," she added. But she didn't have to. We already knew that she and Rosco shared an extraordinary bond, and we could hear in her voice her dedication to give Rosco the best home she could.

She just needed a little help.

A week later, Melissa brought Rosco into the Dunmire Veterinary Clinic at Homeward Pet, and that afternoon, with Rosco recovering from his procedure, they were off to the home they would now share. Their forever home.

Keeping animals in their homes is at the heart of what we do. It's why our Adopter Support team is available to help every adopter with the transition of their new pet into their home; it's why the Homeward Pet Food Bank distributes pet food and supplies to 9 area food banks, including HopeLink, helping 700 families a week provide for their pets; and it's why we didn't hesitate when Melissa needed our help to keep her family together. "You guys were really great for doing this for me. Thank you," Melissa told us when she picked up Rosco. But she didn't have to. Rosco's wagging tail said it all.



As one of Washington State's leading no-kill animal shelters, Homeward Pet Adoption Center's mission is to give homeless animals a second chance through our rescue, shelter and adoption programs.


From the Operations Director

Giving More Animals Hope

Thanks to your generous support, 2015 is turning out to be our best year ever. Eight months into our 25th Anniversary year, you've helped us place nearly 1,100 cats and dogs into their forever homes, and we're on pace to do more adoptions this year than ever before.

One of the things we're most excited about is the increase in cat adoptions at Homeward Pet this year, as the number of unwanted litters born each year continues to be a major issue across the state. Through August, our adult cat adoptions are up over 18%!

All of your status shares on social media, personal referrals to friends and family, and generous gifts are making a meaningful difference in the lives of our cats and dogs.



But it's not just about the number of animals that find their forever homes. It's also about the Special Needs animals that require extra medical or behavioral attention, and the quality of care that, with your help, we're able to provide every animal during their stay. Neo, a beautiful 10 year old cat, was surrendered after her owner passed away. She needed extraordinary care from our clinic, including surgery to remove a cancerous mammary gland, treatment for hyperthyroid and a history of anemia. Through it all, she was the sweetest cat, and finally regained her health and a loving home with one of our amazing volunteers. Another story from the frontlines is Wynn, a Chiweenie, weighed less than 5 lbs. and came to us after a previous trauma had broken his hip. Our clinic was able to save him by amputating his leg. He was adopted to his forever home the moment his recovery was complete!

Not a day goes by that we aren't thankful for the tremendous support we receive from our caring community. Every donor, every adopter, every volunteer and staff member all share the same goal – to give every animal we take in every chance to find their forever home. Thank you for being part of the Homeward Pet Family.
