Roxy had several medical and behavior challenges that may have overwhelmed other animal shelters. Thankfully, Homeward Pet has a team of dedicated programs to help animals like her.

Between a heart murmur, chronic infections, IBD, and more, Roxy needed extensive, specialized care. Whoopi's Fund for Special Needs Animals stepped up to provide it all. Additionally, Roxy was easily overstimulated by petting, leading to a higher likelihood of accidental scratching and biting. Our Cat Behavior Team worked to desensitize her to petting with positive reinforcement and medication. Thanks to the efforts of many animal lovers, Roxy found her home.

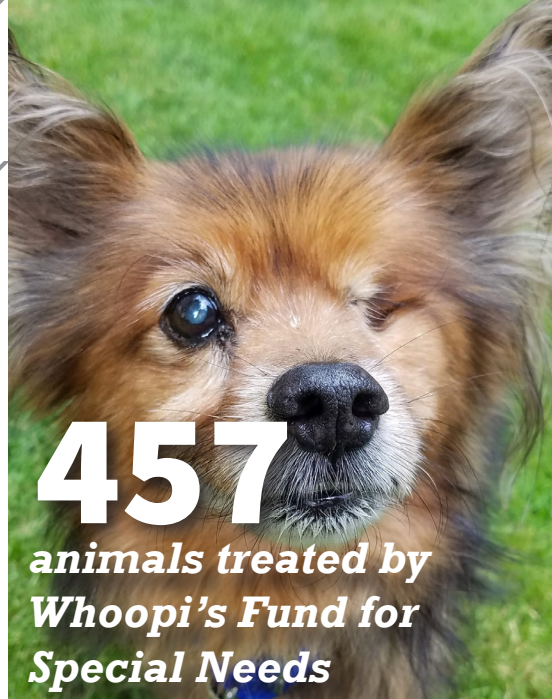
“She is a treat to have,” say her adopters, Tim and Jenni.

Homeward Pet's mission is to give homeless animals a second chance through rescue, shelter, and adoption.

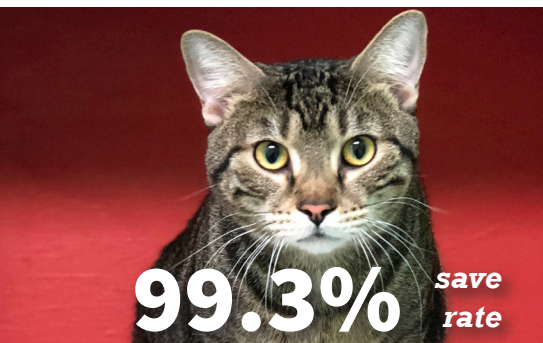

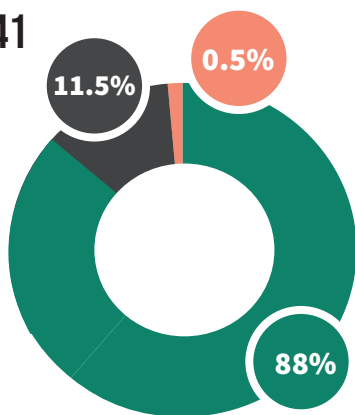
