Where to adopt Barn Cats



What is a barn cat? Barn cats are feral, un-socialized, or free-roaming cats (also called "Community Cats" or "Working Cats") who cannot be placed as pets in a home environment. Placing them as outdoor cats in barns, sheds, garages or other outdoor structures is a humane and practical alternative to euthanasia. Barn cats can live out their lives in relative security and comfort. In return, they'll deter rodents and other pests.
