When Amber's owner passed away, she came to Homeward Pet. Saddened by the loss of her home and overwhelmed by the stress of change, Amber stopped eating. Her lack of appetite soon became life-threatening and required serious medical help.

Thankfully, Homeward Pet's amazing supporters made her recovery possible. Her treatment—a half dozen vet visits, a feeding tube, and round-the-clock foster care for nearly four months—resulted in a long but incredibly successful recovery.

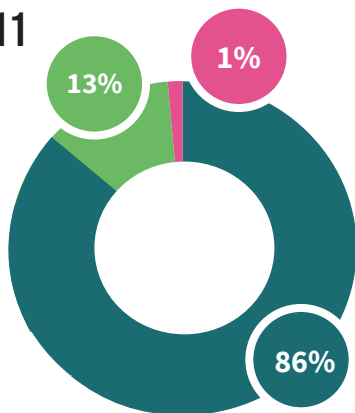

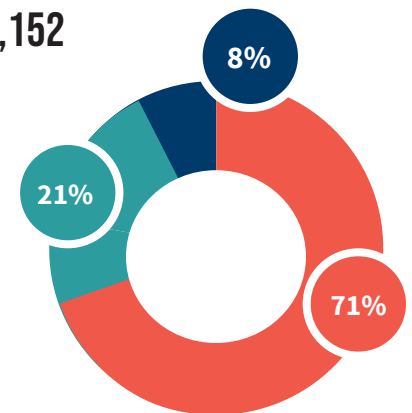
