POSITION SUMMARY:

The Animal Care and Adoption Specialist is responsible for working with the public to match the appropriate companion animals with potential adopters. This position is also responsible for the day-to-day care of the shelter cats and dogs including feeding, exercising, medicating, monitoring for behavioral or medical issues, supervising and working alongside volunteers in general animal care, and helping to maintain a clean, healthy environment for our animals and visitors. Additionally, the Animal Care and Adoption Specialist will help provide opportunities for animals' enrichment, socialization and training.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Have a desire to make a positive difference in the lives of animals
- Customer service experience and strong interpersonal skills
- Ability to work with a diverse group of individuals, including staff, volunteers and customers

- Experience in animal care and handling. Priority will be given to those with hands-on experience in a shelter or animal-related professional setting

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

• Provide counseling to potential adopters in an open, conversational manner to match them to an appropriate cat or dog; have knowledge in general and specific animal care, how to introduce animals, and Homeward Pet's adoption process

- Supervise and work alongside volunteer crews during morning and evening animal care shifts. Help train and mentor, and ensure that policies and procedures are followed in the care of Homeward Pet's cats and dogs
- Provide general animal care to shelter animals, including feeding, cleaning, medicating, rehabilitation, exercise and monitoring for medical or behavioral issues
- Provide specific animal care in enrichment, socialization and training under the direction of HPAC's Behavior Program Manager
- Help maintain a clean, healthy environment for animals and visitors; clean kennels and common areas of the shelter, do laundry, etc.
- Perform other related duties as requested.

WORK ENVIRONMENT:

- Considerable walking, standing and moving of animals and supplies
- Employee will be required to have the physical strength to lift up to 50 lbs. and safely and effectively control large and/or rambunctious dogs
- The noise level in the work environment may be loud at times
- Exposed to toxic or caustic chemicals (cleaners, disinfectants and medical products) on a daily basis
